This can include things like: stations, water towers, shanty's, handcar sheds, switch and interlocking towers, engine houses, round houses, etc. And remember, our photo contest entries can be either of the prototype or models. Some have asked about photo contest entries... Here are the guidelines, which pretty much follow NMRA photo contest rules.

For our contests, entries can be B&W or Color. Prototype or Model (unless specified otherwise)

All photo entries "should" be mounted and/or matted. No glass frames or plastic sleeves.

Photos should be on good quality photo print grade paper

Minimum photo size: 5" x 7" with a minimum mat size (if matted) of 8" x 10"

Maximum for matted photos should not exceed 12" x 16"

Maximum for mounted (un-matted) photos cannot exceed 12" x 16"

Book Review
Taking the Cars: A History of Columbus Union Station
Jeffrey T. Barbee

This is the history of the *Columbus Union Station*, which was also known as *Columbus Union Depot*. It covers the three structures that served this purpose for the 129 years that passenger trains served Columbus. It has four maps of the station area and 51 pictures and newspaper articles of the station complex. It also has some brief information on the very early rail lines that served Columbus and their successors.

One of the major problems with the second structure was that the tracks crossed High Street at grade. In 1891, Columbus conducted a study which showed that in a typical 24-hour period 233 trains, 2180 cars and 211 light engines,

crossed High Street. To compound that, over 40,000 pedestrians and 7300 vehicles crossed the tracks. This survey helped to show the need for a new depot which included the High St. viaduct that still exists. As late as the mid-1950's Columbus was served by 42 passenger trains, and we can only guess how many freight trains went under the viaduct that year.

This is a well written book that anybody interested in the history of Columbus and it's railroads, should have in their library.

There were 29 Boy Scouts from the Simon Kenton Council, BSA, whose service area covers most of Central Ohio. The clinic was an all-day event with the scouts working on the various elements needed to meet the requirements for this award.

The scouts participated in discussions about various topics including prototype and modeling material, such as passenger timetables and scheduling, freight car types and commodities hauled, railroad hand, whistle and trackside signals, the history of railroads on America, and model scales and gauges.

Scouts also participated in a discussion with our resident prototype engineer, Jim Kehn, about the various employment opportunities on the railroads.

Some of the highlights of the day were: a presentation on *Railroad Safety* by Gina Sheldon, Ohio Director for Opera-

tion Lifesaver, about the many aspects of safety on and around railroad trains, tracks and property. The construction of a HO scale model car kit by each scout. This activity was led by Mike Wolf and assisted by all the presenters. Each scout also had the opportunity to operate on a switching layout built by Dexter Hill, with helpful hints from Matt Goodman and Greg Short.

Many thanks to our presenters and helpers for their assistance with this clinic and for showing young folks our hobby of model railroading. Part of Gary's Obituary:

Gary J. Burdette, 66, of Point Pleasant passed away March 15 at Cabell Huntington Hospital after a brief battle with colon cancer.

He was born February 4, 1951 in Parkersburg, WV to the late Bevan and Garnet Burdette. He was a 1969 graduate of Wahama High School and graduated from Marshall University with a BA in General and Biological Sciences and an MA in Counseling. He retired after 34 years of teaching science at Point Pleasant Junior High School and serving as counselor and work based facilitator at Point Pleasant High School. During those years, he spent countless hours creating props and drawing and painting backdrops for the Black Knight Marching Band competition shows and the Black Knight Revue. Loving all things trains, he joined the National Model Railroader Association and became a Master Model Railroader. Serving as superintendent of the NMRA Coal Division, he worked to further both the joy of model railroading and promote the history and heritage of the railroads. The St. Albans Depot and Gallipolis Freight Depot renovations were among his many projects. A longtime member of the C&O Historical Society, he was editor of the Basement Subdivision, a modeling column in their monthly newsletter. Putting his modeling skills to good use, he authored the book "Modeling the C&O" which was published and sold at hobby and craft stores.
