Clinic Teasers

Darrell Logan, Clinic Chair

Oct 14, 2018 - Prototype Signals - What they mean

Rich Harley will explain to the division members the different signals used on the railroad. What does that signal mean and what action is the engineer required to take? Does it me go ahead, stop and wait, or continue past but be prepared to stop. A signal card will be provided to each member present to take and study and see if they can adapt the prototype meanings to their layouts.

Nov 4, 2018 - Backdrop - to Finished Scenery (Part 1)

Rich Hartley and Darrell Logan will demonstrated the first part of painting and installing a backdrop on your layout. It will be based on the concept that you have already have painted "sky" color backdrop. We will demonstrate how to paint clouds on to your backdrop. After the clouds are painted we will then start to paint a backdrop using a very easy technique that you will be able to complete on your own layout.

A session will be allocated to allow everyone present a chance to paint clouds using the techniques we will demo. After the cloud session will we will have pre-painted sections with clouds to allow you the modeler to try the technique we use for painting backdrops.

Jan 2019 – Backdrop – to Finished Scenery (Part 2)

Starting at the first of the year meeting, we will continue with this backdrop clinic and start to add additional details to help you see just how easy it is to create a backdrop. You might have some ideas of your own that you might wish to share. Just because this is how we do it doesn't mean it is the only way. This is what we have found that works best for us and it is easy for you to duplicated. Who knows we may have a Van Gogh in our mist.

2019 - Air Brakes - How they Work

Later in 2019, Rich Hartley will present a clinic of how air brakes work on the prototype so you will be able to understand just what it takes to stop/start a train. He will also explain what you don't want to stop a train unless you have no other option. Just because you have anti-lock brakes, trains do not. Too fast you have an issue, to slow you have an issue also.

JOE SLANSER (1932–2018) RIP

Joseph A. Slanser, age 85, passed away about 1 am on the morning of 3 July. He entered this life on September 25, 1932 in Marion and was the sole child of Joseph and Hazel Slanser.

Joe worked briefly for the Erie Railroad before joining the Army where he served in Korea just after the Korean War. Upon returning to Marion he started his career at GTE an engineer. After 36 years with GTE, now Verizon, he retired.

He was a long-time NMRA, MCR and Division 6 member, having joined in 1950. Joe was a Master Model Railroader and belonged to several area model railroad clubs during his life.

His fascination with trains, especially model trains, was very evident to anyone who knew him. He helped to form the Marion Model Railroad Club, was a member of the Marion Union Station Association, The Columbus Model Railroad Club, and The National Model Railroad Association. He was also a major benefactor of The Marion Union Station Association. His abilities were such that the Columbus Model Railroad Club allowed him to join as a teenager - and was still a member 58 years later.



Joe was a lifelong bachelor and had no children, but his life was full of friends and many interests. His memory will be cherished by anyone who was fortunate to have known him.

Division 6 and the hobby have lost a great friend and modeler.

There is a memorial service planned at Marion Union Station on Thursday, August 2 at 7 pm. There are no calling hours or other events planned.

Joe was a life-long collector of models, and many of those models will be up for auction on August 25th. We're told that he had a huge collection of brass locomotives - including some from the forties and fifties.

2nd Place: Bruce McDonald – Concrete Coaling Tower near Marion



Member Recruitment and Retention Committee Update

We have two topics this month - the first one regards the committee name. In the April edition of the *Super's Signal* (https://archive.div6-mcr-nmra.org/Super-SigFold/18D_Signal.pdf), Mike Wolf introduced our new committee - but noted that it had not been named yet. Well, now it has - we are the **Member Recruitment and Retention Committee**. Conveniently, it abbreviates to "MRR Committee" - just in case we get tired of typing the whole name.

The second topic is longer - an overview of the guiding ideas behind the committee. At our first official meeting, we tossed around some ideas to help define what our purpose was, so that we could stay focused on relevant items. That led to the development of the committee's scope of work and its supporting goals. Following are those items, with some contextual details.

Scope

We decided on the following two points for the committee's scope of work. If an idea does not naturally fit under one of these two headings, it's not a good fit for the committee (even if it's a good idea).

I. New member acquisition - Includes any idea that seeks out new members, through any channel.

The "channel" could mean one-on-one recruitment, having a presence at a public show, a social media campaign or similar.

2. Member retention - Includes any memberrelated efforts that take place *after* someone has signed up.

Any idea that gives a member a good reason to *remain* a member would fit in this category. As it turned out, this is a VERY broad category.

Once we decided the scope of our committee, we laid down some ground rules – goals - to further help keep us on track.

Goal 1 - Identify outreach opportunities and program changes/additions that attract and retain new members.

This one seems pretty obvious – many of the ideas the come out of the MRR Committee will fall under this goal.

This goal covers the more visible ideas (more clinics, train shows presence, etc.)

Goal 2 - Institutionalize new member development. This is a permanent effort that should become part of the culture that every member understands and actively practices.

The idea behind this goal is that members will be more engaged in the division if they are actively involved in some form. Involvement runs the gamut from being welcoming to new members to giving a clinic to supporting someone who is nervously presenting their first clinic! The "institutionalize" part of this goal means that being involved and supportive becomes the norm – part of our culture. If it becomes part of our culture it will, in turn, rub off on new members – a virtuous cycle.

Goal 3 - All efforts should be sustainable by a volunteer organization, without relying on blitzes or putting all the effort on individual members.

This goal is about making sure that the ideas that come out of this committee can be implemented - and more importantly - continued without burning anyone out. If it takes more than an hour or two per week, it increases the chances that the effort won't be successful over time. From a more practical standpoint, less effort will hopefully encourage more people to volunteer. After all, no one wants to volunteer for a full-time job!


