## 2019 Central Ohio RPM Marion Ohio

This past April, I attended an RPM (Railroad Prototype Modelers) meet at the Marion Union Station in Marion, Ohio. This particular RPM, called the Central Ohio RPM, was started by Denis Blake, his wife and a couple of friends, ten years ago - all of those years at the same location.

Before describing this event, a quick background of RPM Meets is in order for those of you who may not be familiar with them. The first event in the RPM vein occurred in the early eighties, though the Railroad Prototype Modeler (RPM) name wasn't adopted until 1990. Early on, the yearly events were often held in conjunction with the NMRA National convention, but in more recent years, meets have become established regionally. The longest running of these, for example, is the RPM Conference, which has been held in the western suburbs of Chicago for twenty-five years. Well established meets can be found in just about every region of the country.

Modelers who attend RPM meets are focused on building models to a very high level of fidelity, using photos and historical research to ensure accuracy. This means the modeler is attempting to reproduce a specific car, building or locomotive as it appeared at a particular moment in time – including correct numbering, hardware details (for example, the right door and roof combinations on a box car, horns and grills on a diesel), weathering and even chalk marks and (for more modern cars), graffiti. I like to think of RPM modelers as being similar to the military modelers we hear and read a lot about in today's model railroading press. RPM participants also put a premium on sharing what they've learned with others in this particular niche – and one of those sharing methods are the annual meets, such as the one in Marion.

As noted above, the Central Ohio RPM has been hosted in Marion for ten years. This year, there were

over 400 models on display(!); mostly in HO scale, but with larger scales also present. This particular meet attracts more modern-era modelers, with the majority of locomotives and rolling stock being from the sixties or later. While I am a steam guy, I really admire the guy who do a good job of grunging up a diesel. Some of those locomotives looked very much like they had been pulled directly off the dilapidated mainline of the 1960's Erie Lackawanna or off the front of a heavy 1970's N&W coal drag.

The selection of models remained on display for the entirety of the three-day event. The owners would cycle between socializing in the model room and attending clinics. To a person, if the builders were at their table, they were always willing to answer questions about the models, their techniques, their research, etc. RPM events are somewhat unique in that many models are displayed in an in-progress state – in fact, this is encouraged. This semi-complete state accomplishes two things, from my perspective; dissimilar materials used in construction stand out, making it easier to determine how the model was assembled, or which details were added. Secondly, this “naked” state also makes it easy for the modeler's peers to provide input on things that could be changed, corrected or lauded. This makes sense, given the goal is absolute fidelity to the prototype.

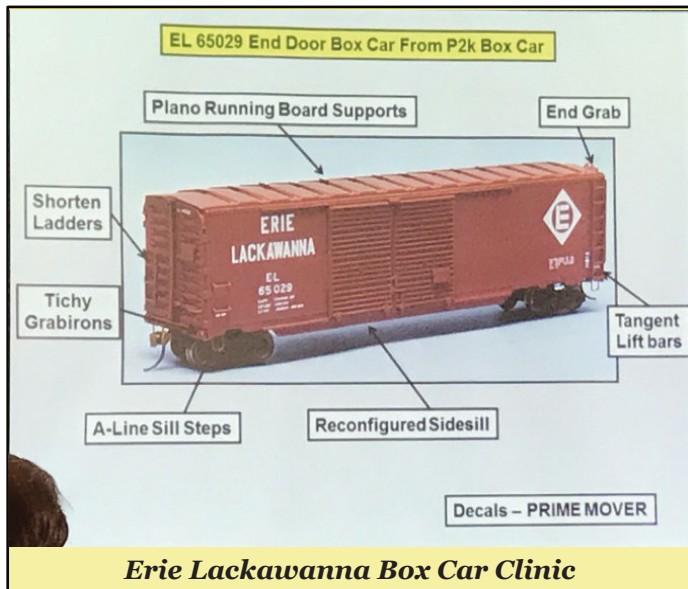
RPM meets are also known for hosting a lot of clinics.



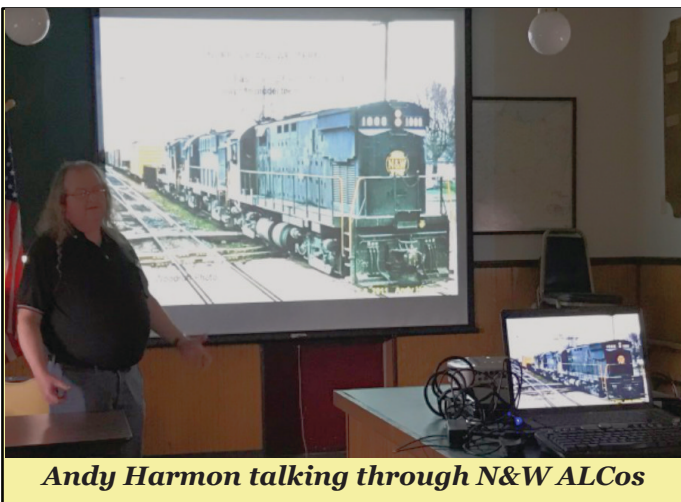

and the clinics generally have a very narrow focus. Some focus on a prototype subject, others focus on techniques and some mix the two. This RPM was no different - I only attended one day, but Denis told me there were twelve clinics over the three “official” days of the meet, in addition to a slide show on the set-up day. The clinics I attended covered the *Construction of Erie-Lackawanna Boxcars* (who knew there were so many varieties of roofs on a boxcar – before that clinic, I thought all seventies boxcars looked the same...),



a discussion of the *ALCo diesel fleet of the N&W*, the various models that had been produced of them, and which ones needed which changes to best represent the N&W's locomotives



and (lastly) our own Butch Sage's clinic on the *Maine Two-Foot Railroads*.



I've attended this RPM three or four times, and I always learn something. At this year's event, I learned about Tamiya's panel line washes – used to highlight (low light?) those details and met a fellow modeler that has a collection of slides from an area I model. Leading up to and during this meeting, Butch and I also had several discussions with Denis on ways our two organizations could benefit or support one another – networking is never a bad thing. Along those lines, expect to see more information about the 2020 Central Ohio RPM in the *Super's Signal* and (perhaps) a visit from Denis to one of our meetings to better explain the sub-culture of RPMs.

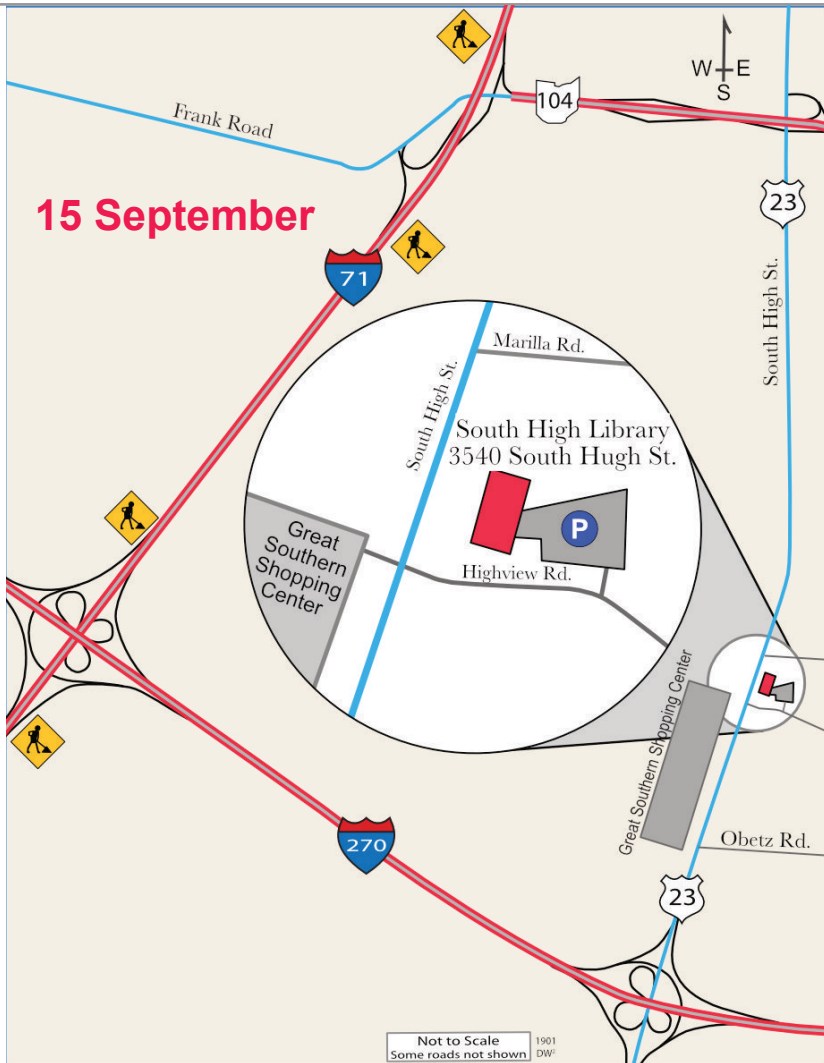
