#### **Business News**

The Steering Committee wrapped up some outstanding tasks at our April meeting. Chief among those items was settling on a vendor to produce new Division 6 Shirts - Susie Kehn. Susie offered a very competitive rate, plus the ability to produce shirts in limited runs. This was a key factor in allowing the division to avoid up-front financial commitments or carrying inventory. Mrs. Kehn also has a track record with the division. She produced the shirts for the convention several years ago and has produced shirts for other local railroadrelated groups. On top of those qualifications, her husband is a long-time member of the division. So it's fantastic to keep this business close to home.

Pat Hreachmack suggested the shirt project at December's meeting. He observed that some members' convention-era shirts are starting to show some wear or are

"shrinking". Many thanks to Pat and Dick Briggs for their work on this. Expect more information on shirt ordering in future communication.

We also discussed a project we were kicking around to create 3D-printed refrigerator car "cores." They would fit commercially available card-stock refrigerator car sides. For a variety of reasons, this project is being set aside.

Lastly, the Committee began discussing the possibility of collaborating with Smoke Stack Hobby Shop on their annual Hobby Expo in Lancaster. Don from Smoke Stack approached us with this idea in March. We have to determine the extent of the collaboration.

#### **Clinics:**

After the division meeting, the members saw three miniclinics today.

- Matt began with a short clinic on *Wiring and Soldering*. Featured in his clinic were several tools including a Soldering paste with a pinpoint applicator, a briefing on soldering wire under rails, and several tools available on Amazon. He also discussed an easy method to connect electrical busses under the table with a new style of connector and wire strippers.
- Howdy provided a mini-clinic demonstrating how to install a curved turnout between two existing curved tracks to create a passing track. He also mentioned that when using hand throws, set a railroad track spike beneath the throw bar head so the throw bar does not go all the way to the ground. Howdy reminded us that using high-quality Shinohara turnouts are great but that these turnouts must have an electrical gap cut in the rails after the frog position.
- Mike Wolf discussed adding interiors into building kits as he assembled the kits. He demonstrated trimming windows before he attached them. Another way he installs windows is to create a second frame using his 3D printer. The original frame and the second inside window frame can sandwich the "glass" between them.

#### - IndyJunction 2022 Convention

The Tri-Regional Indy Junction 2022 Convention and RPM event, held in May, was by all accounts, a great success. While official numbers aren't out, it is generally agreed that over 500 people attended. People drove from as far away as Texas, Iowa, and Maryland, and at least one flew from Scotland. I'll give the new president credit – he's a traveler!

I saw a lot of division faces while there, several of whom shared their talents by presenting clinics. This was no cakewalk, given the convention's goal of presenting each clinic twice. Along with clinics, there was also the traditional rail yard sale, contest room, layout tours, and operating sessions. Several things made this convention unique. The first was the involvement of three NMRA Regions. That virtually guaranteed more (and different) clinicians and topics. The second was the addition of a slate of RPM clinicians and topics. Which (generally) have a different, more focused vibe than NMRA content. The third was in the inclusion of a train show, with formal vendors in one ballroom and individual sellers in another. Last was the inclusion of seven(!) layouts on-site.

If you went, I hope you had a great time. More convention coverage is elsewhere in this issue.
