Many thanks to the volunteers who helped make our Cambridge Train Show / Swap Meet a success in October. We had volunteers at the ticket table, recruiting table, and setting up and tearing down. (Figure 1)

However, the actual recognition goes to Greg Short. None of this would have been possible without his advocacy seven years ago for a Train Show in an area with a shortage of events like this.

Greg will tell you that the overall attendee headcount doesn't matter (the amount of our spending is more important!). (Figure 2) I was pleased to see that attendance was up about 10% over last year. Our advertising played a role in that – 43 (21%) of attendees saw our ad on Facebook, and 28 (13%) saw our flyer.

Achievement Program Report: Dick Briggs. There was no Achievement Program Report.

Publications Report: Don Wilke. Don expects the October issue of the *Super's Signal* to be short, with limited information to report. He plans to prepare a page on the division's website on Monday for the *Train Show* and the results on Tuesday for the contests. The *Super's Signal* deadline on Thursday, September 21, is a hard deadline this time.

Membership Report: Ken McDonough. On Ken's behalf, Matt reported that we have 144 division members, which includes one new member and eighteen renewals. We have four members who are 30 days past renewal and three who are 60 days past renewal.

Retention and Recruitment Report: Mike Wolf. The Membership Committee will set up our recruiting booth at the *Division 6 Train Show* in October. We will not have a booth at the *Buckeye Railroadiana and Model Trains Show & Sale* in December. The committee plans on attending the *Great American Train Show* in mid-January at the State Fairgrounds.

Nominations and Elections Report: Butch Sage. Matt reminded us that all four officers (Super, Assistant Super, Clerk, and Paymaster) are term-limited from seeking reelection, but they may run for a different office. Any member who wishes to nominate oneself or someone else to an office should contact Butch Sage or Jim Kehn. Don will publish job descriptions in the *Super's Signal* in about four to six weeks. Also, see the **Division 6 Regulations**. There is a link on the All About Us on the division"s website. Nominations Chair will accept nominations from the membership before or during the November meeting. The Nominations Chair will close the nominations after the meeting.

Car Project Report: Greg Short. Greg brought the *Buckeye Steel Castings Gondolas* to sell at the meeting. They are \$27 plus shipping/handling if ordering by mail. The webmaster will post details on the web by Tuesday.

Train Show Report: Greg Short. We are five weeks away. Table sales are going well. We will line up volunteers soon for opening/set up and closing/cleanup.

Fliers continue to go out to a variety of places.

Car Project Report: Greg Short. The Oxide Red *Buckeye Steel Castings* gondolas are here. We have already sold about one-fourth of them. Greg plans to make unsold gondolas available at the *Cambridge Train Show*.

2025 MCR Convention Report: Greg Short. We are currently in "cruise mode." the Convention Committee will start meeting monthly at various libraries after the *Train Show*.

501 Committee Report: Mike Wolf. These ad hoc committee members are Ken McDonough, Carter Jastram, Mike Wolf, and Jim Borcz. Jim's research has uncovered two "Employer Identification Numbers" (EINs) in old documents. One document is a copy of a Letter of Determination from the IRS. Ken is working to acquire one. Mike is working on applying for the vendor's license from the State of Ohio after consulting with Jerry Krueger. Once we have the IRS's Letter of Determination, Division 6 will not have to pay tax on our dinner at the 2025 MCR Convention or future purchases. Mike reminded the members that tax-exempt organizations must file an annual report with the Ohio Attorney General's office. Our **Division 6 Regulations** contain two references to our holding 501(c)3 status.

Old Business:

Donated Railroad Books: Carter Jastram. Carter brought the four bins of donated books to the Division 6 meeting for people to peruse. Super Matt Goodman will accept the suggested donation of \$10 per book.

3-D Printed Car Kits: Carter Jastram. Carter brought Jim Borcz's bundle of printed car sides, ends, and a couple of 3-D printed car bodies. Anyone wishing to use these to build box cars should contact Jim.

Division 6 Shirts: Carter Jastram. Carter and Patrick Hreachmack will continue taking orders for Division 6 polo shirts with embroidered first names until at least the end of this calendar year. Jim Kehn, whose wife does the embroidering, said his wife may extend the deadline. Jim is holding onto and distributing the completed shirts.

All Aboard Ohio (AAO): Don Wilke. Don shared information about this effort to reestablish passenger rail service in Ohio. The Federal Rail Administration is considering several possible corridors. Improving the track between Cleveland and Cincinnati to sustain trains doing 79 mph should cost about 1/3 Billion dollars. The current cost of the I-70 – I-71 interchange is over 100 Billion dollars. The AAO and The State of Ohio are looking to Michigan as an example. Trains between Detroit and Benton Harbor run at 79 mph, with over half of that distance at 110 mph.

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Train Show Report Greg Short

The 2023 Train Show is now in the books, and it was a success. We had over 200 attendees, which to some may be a small number, but many of those who came were buyers leaving with boxes or bags of train goodies. We had a good table count at 94 tables sold, even with three vendors backing out, accounting for another 20 tables. Vendors backing out happens seemingly every year for one reason or another. Even with the cancelations, we were in the black on the show before the doors opened. Paymaster Jim will have the numbers in his report, but I am happy with the take. I spoke with many of the vendors and were delighted with their sales. I did notice that a lot of them packed up a lot less than they brought in. Happy vendors are good, as they will return to the Train Show with several stating they will be back next year. There are still things we can do better, and the Train Show group will work on them, but most of it will not be hard. Advertising still seems lacking in some areas, but with new contacts and the discovery of new outlets, it will grow. I had several good comments from both vendors and patrons on how excellent the facility was, the ease of getting to the venue, and how we had the showroom laid out. One thing I did hear a lot was how nice the isle width we had made it very easy to navigate the hall and not have to fight to get through. The vendors also say this makes it easier to police their tables.

I cannot go without saying a huge thanks to everyone who helped make the day successful. There was a lot of work getting the setup and teardown done. As expected, the setup was a bit sluggish at first, but it picked up. A lot of that is on me as it is just not putting the tables up but also making sure tables we set up in a way that fits the vendors. Going into it, I have an idea of how I need to do it, but it will never be the same every time, as the number of tables going to a given vendor changes year to year, which will change the vendor count. As I stated before, if all the vendors had made it, we would have had our highest table count yet, which I want to exceed next year. Teardown was lighting fast, and we were all done and gone before 4 p.m. The teardown is the fastest we have ever done. Much of that comes from vendors that do not mess around and have a suitable teardown method. It also helps if they do not need to pack up everything that they showed up with, and this was the case. So, as the vendors were packing up, our folks were putting the tables and chairs away.

To the folks at the T-TRAK and the Division 6 tables, thanks. I know there were several members floating through during the show and helping out, and since I can't remember everyone, I will just say thanks to the group.

We need to thank the N-Scale group from Athens for coming back and setting up the layout again this year. The layout looked bigger this year, even though I didn't have time to look at it. I hope they come back next year. Along with that, I hope that we can get HO and O-Scale layouts to be part of the show. We have the room as we have more space that we can use. So, if anyone knows where we can get a layout, let me know, as it would be great to have several scales represented. As we know, this is important to the non or new modeler to spark the interest.

So, if anyone has a suggestion on how we can do something better, let me know. As I stated before, I am pleased with the show and its success. We made some money for the division and had fun. I only lost a little sleep and had minor headaches worrying about things, but it all worked out due to everyone's help.

Oh, and on your calendar, I have reserved the Pritchard Laughlin Center for October 27, 2024, for the next Train Show.

Hello Friends

Some of you remember me, some probably do not. I'm writing to you with a request.

After many years of living in a house, last March, medical issues forced me to move into a senior living facility. As part of that process, I had to dispose of my collection of trains, model railroad supplies, accessories, etc. It just wouldn't fit into a studio apartment. I kept a few pieces. I expected I'd be finished with my days of model railroading. Once here, I met a neighbor in essentially the same situation. We had been thinking about building some minimal layout to keep in our apartments. We both realized that such an undertaking wasn't very practical.

While discussing this, we thought, "Why not try to form a club here and see if we can get some space to build a layout?" After some discussion with the facility managers, they granted us the use of a space 10 feet by 25 feet, and we were off. The facility even supported us to the extent that they provided materials for some initial benchwork. The idea is taking off, and we now number six or seven members. Some experienced model railroaders, and some are new to the hobby but very interested. We also have several people interested in the endeavor's scenery aspects but not the trains specifically. It's amazing to see how excited people who thought their time with the hobby was over get at the prospect of continuing and doing it with several like-minded individuals. But we need much more than a few tables.

One of the very first things we did was develop a set of standards for the proposed layout. The central part of this was the dimensions of the benchwork. We have many people here with mobility issues and need to accommodate them. The mobility issues impose limitations on how high the benchwork can be, how deep it can be, and how much clearance we need underneath. Researching this, we couldn't find any guidelines, so we developed our own. We believe that a layout built to these standards will allow a person in a wheelchair to both work on the layout and run trains. As you may know, living in a facility like this is not cheap, and as retirees, we don't have much money.

So, I'm asking you, if you have any to spare, would you be willing to donate supplies to us? We need Code 100 or Code 83 flex track, switches, roadbeds, scenery supplies, rolling stock, and locomotives, about everything you need to build a model railroad. If you can help, please get in touch with me so we can discuss it.
