Superintendent's Report

April 2024

Happy Spring, everyone. It's four days after the March Equinox, i.e., Spring, when the day length is the same everywhere in the world, just under 12 hours and 10 minutes. Technically, day and night are equal lengths at the two equinoxes, but in practice, equal day and night lengths occur about three or four days before the Equinox. That's called the Equilux.

I want to thank Bob Baker for his interesting talk on the Canadian Pacific's Spiral Tunnels that form part of the descent from Kicking Horse Pass. He's wanted to present this for a while, and the wait was well worth it. We recorded his presentation, and I have uploaded it to YouTube for those who didn't see it live. The link is in Mike Wolf's Clinic Corner, or go to our YouTube channel (NMRABuckeyeDivision), and you'll find it (and past videos) there. The video has apparently caught the attention of the algorithm; it's got 188 views, four "likes," and two comments! That, or there are a lot of people doing searches on the Spiral Tunnels.

I believe I have one more Superintendent's Report to write after this one, and then Bob Baker will take over. I decided to look back at my first column, written for the July 2020 Super's Signal, to see what's changed. In it, I spelled out two goals: Leadership Continuity and Website Modernization.

The membership approved the Clerk's Report of the February membership meeting, as published in the February 2024 *Super's Signal*, as corrected above.

Paymaster's Report: Matt Goodman. Jim Borcz is absent. Matt Goodman presented the Paymaster's Report for Jim. The CD is due in May. Paymaster Jim will arrange with the new Paymaster Carter and another officer with signing authority, most likely Mike Wolf, to obtain a new CD. Mike Wolf moved, and Don Wilke seconded to approve the report, subject to audit.

Clinic/Program Report: Mike Wolf. Our next meeting is on Sunday, April 21, at the Gahanna Branch Library. Michael Percy will present a clinic on *Preparing and Using Switchlists and Computer Programs* to enhance operations.

Division 6 will not hold a May meeting since the **North Coast Limited Mid Central Region Convention** meeting will be held from May 16 - 19, 2024, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Middleburg Heights, Ohio.

The June Meeting will be at the Marion Union Station. Butch Sage will present a clinic on *Estate Planning*, a subject he has unfortunately had to deal with recently. Darrel Logan will present a clinic on *Scenery* – *Beginning to End*.

For clinics in July, Dexter Hill, the current Assistant Superintendent, and Michael Percy, the incoming Assistant Superintendent, will collaborate to determine meeting locations and dates.

Ken McDonough reported that the Internal Revenue Ser-

vice approved our application to obtain 501(c) (3) tax-exempt status by a Determination Letter issued on February 16, 2024.

Buckeye Express 2025 Convention: Greg Short. Chair Greg held a planning meeting on Thursday, February 22. He scheduled another meeting for Thursday, March 21, at 7 pm at the New Albany Public Library. Greg noted members have filled all the convention committee chair positions.

Gondola: This is a reminder that the Buckeye Steel Castings HO gondola kits are \$25.00 for members purchased at a Division 6 Meeting (tax included). They are \$27.00 when purchased by mail, with \$10.00 shipping and handling for one car and \$17.00 shipping and handling for two or three cars. Mike Wolf has submitted information about our car sale to the NMRA Magazine and MR Hobbyist.

Old Business:

Darrell Logan suggested that Division 6 have a registration form for the 2025 Buckeye Express Mid Central Region Convention ready to distribute at the North Coast Limited Mid Central Region Convention in May in Cleveland.

It owned hotels, steamships, and car ferries. The *Main Central* sold these assets after WWI ended. The government nationalize the *Main Central* during the First World War. The government returned the *Main Central* to private ownership after the war.

After a motion and a second to adjourn, Matt adjourned the meeting at 2:50 p.m.

Clinic:

Bob Baker gave a clinic on the spiral tunnels of The Canadian Pacific Railway. Bob reviewed the history of Canada and described how the CP tied the new nation together. He described how James J. Hill, a Canadian, advocated for building a new railway in part in the United States. While Cornelius Van Horne, an American, advocated building a new railway entirely in Canada. When the CP approached the Canadian Rockies, the grades were for-

midable. Van Horne convinced the CP to build the line with grades up to 4.5% to get the line in service quickly. That created an operating bottleneck. The CP built three safety spurs coming down the mountain. The railroad aligned the turnouts to take the safety spur unless the train engineer gave a specific signal indicating they had the train under control. Several wrecks occurred due to excessive speed or confusion about the signals. The CP decided to build two spiral tunnels over about five (5) miles, reducing the grade to 2.2%. Bob shared photos of the line, both historic and more recent, to show the terrain the CP line runs through. The Trans-Canada Highway now occupies a good part of the alignment of the original rail line – including the steep 4.5% grades. A very informative clinic – worthy of presentation at a Regional or National Convention! Thanks, Bob!



In addition to providing some Canadian trivia and background information on Canada's transcontinental railroad and the line's original construction and operations on the "Big Hill," Bob discussed the changes made in 1909 when the Railway constructed two spiral tunnels to reduce the steep grades of the original "temporary" routing. Bob illustrated the construction of the tunnels with maps and photographs, showing the line's new alignment and operations. So don't be a hoser, eh! The new **Special Raffle** item is the undecorated Athearn GP-40-2 Diesel Road Locomotive. It's powered and has dynamic brakes. We will try to sell 40 tickets for this item.

Here is some history of this locomotive:

The EMD GP40-2 is a 4-axle diesel-electric locomotive built by General Motors Electro-Motive Division between April 1972 and December 1986. The locomotive's power is a 16-cylinder engine, which generates 3,000 horsepower.

Standard GP40-2 production totaled 861 units, with 817 built for North American and 44 for Mexican railroads.

The locomotives had gearing to reach a maximum of 65-70 mph.

Three Top Original Buyers

Canadian National Railway - 268 units.

Baltimore & Ohio - 218 units. It operated as B&O from 1830 until 1987, when B&O merged into the Chessie System; its lines are today controlled by CSX Transportation.

Conrail - 129 units. Operated between 1976 and 1999.

If you're interested in operating this locomotive on your railroad and making it your design, see Scott Brown for purchasing raffle tickets at the March meeting.

Long-Distance Corridors and Central Ohio



Ohio Rail Development Commission (ORDC) Executive Director Matt Dietrich announced that the ORDC is in the final stages of freeing up money from the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA). The ORDC will use the money to do the feasibility studies (Stage 1) of the two corridors in Ohio that the ORDC nominated. The corridors are the Cleveland—Columbus—Dayton—Cincinnati (3C&D) and Cleveland—Toledo—Detroit corridors. Each corridor will receive half a million dollars. This will allow the ORDC to hire a consultant to undertake the feasibility studies. There will probably be just one consultant for both corridors. Matt stated that this would probably take place fairly quickly. Good news!

The other two Ohio corridors are not sponsored by ORDC. AMTRAK sponsors the Daily Cardinal Service, and the multi-state Midwest Connect sponsors the Pittsburgh— Columbus—Lima—Ft. Wayne—Chicago corridor.
