Communications Report:

Webmaster: Open conversation in Don Wilke's absence. Dick expressed concern that too many Convention pages don't have information yet and wanted to know when they would be updated.

Super's Signal Report: Mike Wolf for Don Wilke.

The December issue of the *Signal* deadline is Thursday, November 21st. If an article is not quite ready, please inform Don how much space it will need.

Media: Groups.io, Facebook: No report.

Membership Report: Bob Baker for Ken McDonough in the latter's absence. The division has 142 members, 14 renewals, and no one in the "thirty-day" bucket in the last roster.

Retention and Recruitment Report: Mike Wolf. Mike reported that the *Railroadiana Show* will be held at the fairgrounds in December. Division 6 will not have a booth at that show. The *Great American Train Show* is January 11-12. As the date approaches, Mike will ask for volunteers, and the show will let him know if there will be a table for us.

Achievement Program Report: Dick Briggs. Dick reports about a dozen people are getting close to completing various certificates, with various excuses as to why they aren't done yet. Dick is creating a list to chase them down.

Last month Mike Wolf, Howdy Lamprecht, and Dick judged Jim Kehn's submissions for his Cars and Author certificates. Some models and articles were very ancient. Those are complete and accepted, and Dick is just waiting on the certificates.

Dick presented Jim Kehn with his **Dispatcher's Certificate**. Jim now needs one more certificate for MMR[®] and aims to complete that before the *Buckeye Express Convention*.

Mike and Dick reminded members working on AP Certificates to read the requirements, don't make it more complex than it needs to be, and (in the case of Cars) to not leave points on the floor by not providing conformance information.

Nominations or Elections Report: Butch Sage. Butch is looking for nominations for Director. Let Butch know of your interest by February.

Buckeye Express Convention: Greg Short. Ken is starting on the clinic's schedule and waiting for the final commitments from some clinicians. Mike Wolf has nailed down the *Hands-On Modeling* details and the extra-fare van tour to Coshocton. He is waiting for feedback on a traction motor tour. The convention website is missing some information. Greg is working on setting banquet pricing; however, the hotel is still unwilling to provide pricing. Division 6 marketing visits are underway, with the majority either completed or scheduled. No visits are planned yet for Division 5, 11 (Western PA), and 10 (Louisville) area).

George Stringer gave an overview of the Contest Room progress and passed around a form for volunteers. He will always need three people in the room (except during lunch) and help with setup and teardown. A discussion about whether the room should be open or closed during judging was taken offline.

Company Store/Car Project and Train Show Report: Greg Short. Greg said the most recent Train Show netted about \$1,300, with some outstanding expenses. Two vendors with multiple tables were no-shows, which impacted net income. Greg is looking into having vendors pay upfront at future shows. Some other minor hiccups included two reported thefts. Jim Kehn noted that bad actors are out there, and each vendor should protect themselves. Some vendors took too long to pack up. Next year's Train Show is the last Sunday in October. Several vendors have already committed to returning. Greg extended his thanks to everyone who helped.

Operation Life Saver: Connie Logan. Connie said she and Darrell talked to 78 people at the *Cambridge Train Show* and 104 people in Dayton. She also reported that she had been selected to train as an RISC instructor (Rail Incident Safety Course—training for first responders in safe operation on and near railroads).




