Retention Committee Progress Report

The Times They Are A Changin'

I've titled this month's committee report with lyrics from Bob Dylan because it best sums up what will be going on at Division 6 meetings in the future. While the Committee will formally meet to discuss the final survey results between the time I write

this and when you read it, incoming Superintendent Dick Briggs and I have already discussed several key changes as we work to transform monthly Division 6 meetings to an environment of Modelers Helping Modelers.

Gone from our monthly meetings are most of the business we have discussed in the past. The "business" portion of the meetings will be limited to Good of the Order-type discussions — upcoming events and Division activities, major decisions made by the Board, etc. If you want details on finances, retention, etc., attend a Board (Bored?) or Steering Committee meeting. The Board of Directors (BOD) meets nearly monthly, and most meetings are held via Zoom. Members cannot vote but are welcome to tune in at any time.

So what other changes can you expect to see? More layout tours, some clinics, but mostly member-led discussions on modeling. Examples include meetings focused on specific topics, such as benchwork and backdrops, wiring your layout, laying track, building structures, modeling scenery and water, AP criteria, and how to tackle paperwork, among many others. If you attended our discussion on adhesives at Smoke Stack Hobbies several years ago, the format will be similar: the discussion leader will organize subtopics in each area, and members will share their successes, failures, and questions regarding the topic. Modelers helping modelers is what we should be all about.

Contests will also change. A rotation of themes will remain (i.e. open freight car, diesel locomotive, passenger car, etc.), but instead of just looking and voting, the member bringing the model will discuss it—the what, when, where, and/or how they modeled it—with an opportunity for others to ask questions. It's a chance to bring, brag, and learn from each other.

There are more exciting short- and long-term ideas and projects emerging from the Retention Committee and your survey inputs. You'll hear more about these in the future. Until then, keep modeling (and good luck getting Bob Dylan's song and harmonica solo out of your head)!






